THE OLD GIRLS' ASSOCIATION.

CONSTITUTION AND RULES.

The Society shall be called The Old Girls' Association of the Oldham Hulme Grammar School for Girls.

The President shall be the acting Head Mistress of the School, and the Secretary shall be one of the members of the School Staff.

The affairs of the Association shall be conducted by a Committee consisting of the President, the Secretary, the Treasurer, and sixteen representative members, of whom one shall be elected by the Staff, fourteen shall be elected by the Old Girls, and one by the members of Form Upper VI. Of the fourteen Old Girls' representatives two shall retire annually in rotation, but they shall be eligible for re-election, and the election shall take place at the December meeting.

Members who, without good cause assigned, absent themselves from Committee meetings for two consecutive years shall be considered to have resigned, and their places shall be filled up at the December meeting at the end of the second year during which they were absent from the meetings.

Full members (*i.e.*, girls who are able to attend the meetings) shall pay a yearly subscription of 3/-. Country members, who are not eligible to attend meetings, shall pay 2/-. Both subscriptions will include the Record.

All subscriptions are due in December, and may be paid at the meeting. No notices will be sent to any member whose subscription is two years in arrears.

There shall be two meetings of the Association each year— at the beginning of December, and on the first Thursday in July, with the exception that in alternate years a picnic on the first Saturday in July shall take the place of the summer meeting at School.

During the last week in November each member shall send to the Secretary at least one warm, useful garment for the poor. Clothing that has been worn, if it is in good condition, is also acceptable.

The Record shall be issued during the Spring Term, and shall be sent to all members who have paid their subscriptions.

Sir GEORGE W. NEEDHAM.

In Sir George Needham the school has lost another valued friend and Governor. The youthful spirit and the love of life which kept him in harness till the end, forgetful of his eighty-four years, sent him to his office each morning and to the meetings of the public bodies on which he served and finally led to the accident which resulted in his death at Bournemouth, on February 29th, after a week's illness.

He never missed a Governors' Meeting unless he was away from home, and always gladly gave the benefit of his sound advice, and showed his interest by informal visits from time to time. His devotion to duty was an example to us all. Nor must we forget his practical generosity to the school; the Art Room in the new building bears his name as a permanent acknowledgment of this.

We shall think of his life and work with affectionate gratitude in the years to come.

Our school, founded in 1895, has reached an age at which in the lives of individuals there come changes within the circle of the family and friends. In our school circle, which is just a big family, these same changes are apparent. Old friends are passing. Last year we lost our honoured first Chairman of the Governors, Lord Emmott. This year, Sir George Needham, a Governor almost from the beginning, has been taken from us. The School is the poorer for their departing.

Changes there are, too, within the building. Old Girls are often heard to say: "We would so like to come and visit the old school, but we don't think we should know anyone there now, and even the old class rooms are closed to us." It is a little pathetic, but it is the inevitable result of the passage of the years. But any Old Girls who would like to visit the old haunts can be sure of a welcome. There are still some on the staff whom they would know; there are also three Old Girls who have come back as mistresses—a valuable link between old and new. Old Girls cannot be too grateful to Miss Bailey for her unfailing interest in their Association and her kindness to all its members.

But there is another point of view. The Old Girls' Association is the "grown-up daughter" of the school, as it were, and the time has come for its members to consider whether they are taking their share in the wider duties of citizenship, those varied "loyalties" as we recently heard it defined. Loyalty to our school should expand into loyalty to our town, thus proving that the many advantages we enjoyed at school have contributed to fit us mentally and morally for higher service. The town is now looking to you to carry on the work so ably begun by others whose hands are now growing weary of the long strain.

Two such calls have come recently. Miss Lees has invited us to send a representative to the Oldham Council of Social Welfare. The Committee at a special meeting elected Lilian Johnson (Mrs. Garfitt) who will no doubt act as a sort of liaison officer between ourselves and the various social welfare activities in the town.

Mrs. Higgs is making her own appeal on behalf of the Beautiful Oldham Society. She has already one valuable helper in Constance Wilde, but more recruits are needed. The work does not appear to be onerous, but on the contrary, varied and interesting. I do entreat you not to let this appeal be made in vain. We must not grow selfish; we must not exist as a society merely to meet and enjoy pleasant evenings together. Our gatherings are always happy times, but if that is all we aim at we shall deteriorate. Surely among our three hundred and fifty members there must be some with leisure, ability and public spirit enough to help. Those willing to try what they can do may send their names either to Mrs. Higgs or to Miss Evington.

This is not to say that the Old Girls have been idle in the past. The Hulme Charity would be much worse off without them; their hand is seen in our new building, at our bazaars, and their Roll of Honour for war work is a worthy one. So be up and doing, Old Girls, carry on the old tradition, and even go one better.

Speaking of bazaars, on the occasion of the last one in December, 1927, we undertook at L. Johnson's suggestion, a pound stall. It was quite an impromptu affair, for the chance for the suggestion arose at the very eleventh hour. When the bazaar opened, the stall displayed about five packages, at the close it handed in about £4 6s. 0d., a very creditable amount. Could not the pound stall become a regular fixture at the bazaar? Nettie Macpherson, League of Pity Secretary and Bazaar Organiser would willingly allot it a place.

Why did so few come to the picnic last year, only thirty-three all told? Those who did not come missed a most enjoyable excursion, and they must forgive us if we who did go are malicious enough to gloat. The programme was specially attractive, we were favoured by the weather, and so the trip was an unqualified success. Picnics are made for our young members, it is just their opportunity to arrange little parties of friends and revel in a day in the country. Perhaps they will be better advised next year.

The school has certainly reached maturity, the proof being that it has now at least three married grandchildren as you will see on referring to the marriage notices.

The next meeting should take place on Thursday, July 5th, try to keep that date open. This summer we shall meet at school.
